June 2016-January 2017

The province has implemented various programs and projects from the DSWD-ARMM under the supervision and facilitation of Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office. These programs include Social Pension for Indigent Senior Citizen, Supplementary Feeding Program in Day Care Service, PAMANA CDD, PAMANA MNLF, Sustainable Livelihood Program (SLP), Pantawid Pamilya Pilipino Program, Bottoms-up-Budgeting and Convergence.

Target City/municipalities are Akbar, Albarka, Hji. Mohammad Ajul, Hji. Muhtamad, Lamitan, Lantawan, Maluso, Sumisip, Tabuan-Lasa, Tipo-Tipo, Tuburan and Ungkaya Pukan.

1. SOCIAL PENSION FOR INDIGENT SENIOR CITIZENS

The Social Pension for Indigent Senior Citizens is in line with our commitments to the International Plan of Action on ageing that seeks to address the dependency needs of older persons, especially priority directions in the areas of social protection and security and alleviation of poverty in old age.

Republic Act 9994 or the "Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010" Provides additional benefits to the senior citizens especially the vulnerable, unprivileged by giving them Php 500.00 a month, releases in every quarter to augment their daily needs.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

For last year 2016, Basilan Province has a total target of 8,872 pensioners. More than 100% increase in beneficiaries compare to the year 2015 that we only served 3,954 pensioners in the 12 c/municipalities.

Last October 2016, pay-out for the release of cash grant was done in 12 c/municipalities to the 8,872 pensioners amounting to PHP 26,616,000.00. Each pensioner received PHP 3,000.00 each from January-June 2016. Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) staff personally conducted pay-out in coordination with the MSWDO Office. For the pensioners who are bed ridden and sickly, MSWD staff hand carried the grant personally in their respective houses. Some of the local chief executives and other municipal officials attended the said activity as a manifestation of their support to the program.

For the period of July-December 2016, we have scheduled pay-out anytime this February 2017.

2. Supplementary Feeding Program in Day Care Service

The Supplementary Feeding Program of the DSWD in partnership with the LGU was implemented since 2013. Supplementary Feeding Program is part of the DSWD's contribution to the Early Childhood and Development (ECCD) Program of the Government to help achieve the Millennium Development Goal in

which is to eradicate extreme poverty and hunger. The program also aims to improve and sustain the nutritional status of all the target children. Most of the beneficiaries are the pre-schoolers of the Pantawid Beneficiaries.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

For this calendar year 2015-2016, Basilan Province has a total target of 6,698 Day care children. Almost 20% increase in beneficiaries compare to last implementation that we only served 5,283 Children beneficiaries of the Supplementary Feeding Program in DCS to the 1 City and 11 municipalities.

The program is in the form of hot meals served during break/snack time in the morning or in the afternoon session for 5 days a week for 120 days. The Day Care Worker with the Parents Committee manages the feeding Program based on the prepared menu cycle. Allocation of which is based on the number of registered children

Aside from feeding children were also taught proper hygiene such as washing the hands before and after eating, table manners and prayer before and after meal. Part of the goal also is to educate the mothers about health and nutrition, so they could sustain the progress children have made during the school feeding days.
